The President asked why the results of Show Jumping were not uploaded on the website on completion of the event. The Secy Gen apologized for the delay and assured remedial actions. The President directed results of National &amp; FEI Events should be uploaded on the Website within 24 hrs. The President also asked suggestions from the forum to prevent negative media publicity. Brig Deep Ahlawat, VSM suggested that an article in prominent journals could be published to cover positive aspects of the sport and this can be initiated by the org of the event in consultation with the Technical Delegates for the same. The delegation further invited Secy Gen to visit AEF from 26 Feb to 29 Feb 2020. Col PP Singh (Retd) asked the Secretary General to explain what discussion took place to enhance the role of India in AEF. The Secretary General informed the house that AEF want more number of AEF level events in India (atleast two / three tournaments in India every year). Col PP Singh (Retd) inquired that he was told by an AEF Official at Asian Continental trials at Pattaya, Thailand in Nov 2019 that election of chairmanship of Group III and asked for an update on the same.</p>

Col PP Singh (Retd) asked as to who/which body is empowered to decide as to who would represent EFI at National/International forums. The Secretary General informed that there was an EC meeting on 29 Mar 2019 wherein an SOP on participation of EFI Office Bearers at various International Forums was prepared and he read out the details mentioned in Appendix M to Item No 9.15 of EC Minutes. Col Tarsem Singh, Member Tent Pegging suggested that EFI should raise the point of inclusion of Tent Pegging events in Asian Games during the AEF General Assembly. During 2018, he raised the point but the AEF was not active at that time but the present set up in the AEF is very active and EFI should raise this point again. The Secretary General agreed to do so.</p>			
<p><b>6.11 Development of Equestrian Hubs.</b> The Secy Gen informed the house that the last EC had deliberated on the hubs &amp; equipments required to be procured by EFI. It was unanimously decided by the house for indigenous footing. However other items were to be procured as per Manual for Procurement of Goods 2017. <p><b>6.16 Review of Technical Guidelines.</b> The Secretary General informed the house that the Tech Guidelines for all disciplines needs to be reviewed for eg. in Dressage there are number of requests for re-introduction of Advance Medium category which was removed from this year onwards, only one MER for upgradation instead of two which is existing in present guidelines, one is National and one is FEI Dressage World Challenge etc. The Secretary General added that the guidelines for Show Jumping has some flaws and needs updation. Brig Deep Ahlawat, VSM, Member Eventing suggested that after completion of the competitions all guidelines to be reviewed. Vice President (Adm) suggested to nominate a committee alongwith Chairman Athletes Commission for review of Technical Guidelines. <p><b>6.17 Empanelment of EFI Officials (Judge / Course Director /Technical Delegate/ Steward).</b> The Secretary General informed the house that in the previous EC there was a suggestion that the list of EFI empanelled officials be reviewed since no guideline for same exists. Brig Deep Ahlawat informed the house that the list of existing EFI Officials be put up to the Committee (consisting of Vice President (Tech), Member Disciplines and Secretary General) who will fix parameters for being an EFI empanelled official for various disciplines and short clinics will be conducted to assess them at EFI approved events. The Syllabus for conduct of these assessment and their upgradation to national official/judge will be similar to FEI. The Secretary General added these assessments will also be in Roman Hindi for those who are not fluent in English. Col Tarsem Singh Warraich, Member Tent Pegging requested the house to include FEI/ITPF Rules because Tent Pegging also needs new officials. <p><b>6.18 Accreditation of Indian Coaches.</b> The Secy Gen appraised the house that there is no guideline/system in the Federation for empanelment of National Coaches. He suggested that FEI programme can be utilized to tackle this issue.</p>	The house perused the same and accepted the proposal.	Secy Gen	
<p><b>6.19 Outstanding Claims.</b> The Secretary General informed the house that there are a number of financial claims pertaining to various coaching camps/foreign exposure on Govt expense for participation at Regional events and expenses related to the Asian Games. These financial claims had in principle sanction from Sports Authority of India (SAI) and expenditure for all such events are generally met through the federation fund and on completion of the event, the final claim is preferred to the concerned Regional SAI paying Office.</p>	<p>The EC deliberated on the matter and agreed to write off the following in order to regularise the outstanding account status of the NF. <p>Amongst the various financial claims forwarded for settlement, certain amounts have been disallowed in audit with reasons. However these amounts are still being shown as amount due for receipt from various Regional SAI Paying Offices. Efforts have been made to get these amounts passed but it is unlikely that these sum would be released.</p> <p>In order to regularize the accounts of the federation, it is proposed to obtain approval of the EC to write off long outstanding dues which are unlikely to be paid by SAI. The details of financial claims which require approval of the house to write off amounts which have been disallowed in audit are placed at <b>Appendix 'F'</b>.</p> <p>While the accounts were under discussion the President enquired about the case pertaining to Embassy Group. The Joint Secy informed the house that post submission of the final claim of the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games to SAI, Embassy Group has forwarded bills pertaining to expenditures incurred in Europe related to the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games to the tune of Rs 35 lakhs. However, this has not been included in the final claim submitted to SAI nor any supplementary claim forwarded on this account and the matter is pending. <p>sponsor the entire Eventing Team for the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games, then why is a claim being made towards expenditures incurred for the same? The President enquired if any agreement alongwith liabilities was made with Embassy Group pertaining to the sponsorship of the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games. The Joint Secy informed the house that based on a letter of consent received from Mr Jitu Virwani, the entire case was forwarded to MYAS for approval which was subsequently accorded.</p> <p>The Joint Secy further informed the house that Embassy Shelters, a subsidiary of the Embassy Group has taken up a case with Min of Youth Affairs and Sports to accord sanction to transfer USD 2.5 million to a company in Europe on account of expenditures incurred for sponsoring the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games Eventing team. A certificate of concurrence is required from the National Federation to process the case and the Ministry has asked for comments on the same. Col PP Singh (Retd) commented that probably efforts are being made to transfer funds to Europe under the aegis of EFI. Mr Jitu Virwani has a European company by the name Equis India and all expenditures for the sponsorship of the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games were made through this company. The Secy Gen informed the house that Embassy Group has authorized Col Rajesh Pattu, SJRP, VSM (Retd) to deal with EFI as their authorized representative on this matter.</p>	<p>The house recommended that a response on these lines can be forwarded to MYAS in reference to the aforesaid matter.</p> <p>The house was of the opinion that the claim of approx. Rs 35 lakh forwarded by Embassy Group on account of expenditures made in Europe pertaining to the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games was part of the sponsorship offered by Mr Jitu Virwani, hence preferring a claim in this regard was not in order. Secondly, since the federation has already forwarded the final claim to SAI for the 18<sup>th</sup> Asian Games which now stands settled, entertaining a supplementary claim at this stage is not feasible and hence not recommended.</p>

Vice President (Vet) sought a clarification if Embassy Group wanted a compensation for the money which was earlier due. Joint Secretary clarified that the 18 <sup>th</sup> Asian Games claim amount was approx Rs 35 lacs whereas the amount sought for transfer is approx Rs 18 crores. Vice President (Adm) enquired that if the 18 <sup>th</sup> Asian Games happened in Aug 2018 then why this late reaction to claim, more than a year later as the federation has written to all concerned to submit claims post 2018 Asian Games for re-imbursement. The Joint Secy clarified that the claim of approx Rs 35 lakhs on account of expenditures incurred in Europe was received after the final claim for the 18 <sup>th</sup> Asian Games was forwarded to SAI for settlement. The case for transfer of USD 2.5 million to Europe was also initiated in 2018 by Embassy Shelters but the same was pending with the Ministry and off late fresh correspondence have been initiated by Embassy Shelters.
