<p>4.9 <b><u>Qualification Chart Asian Games Show Jumping and Eventing.</u></b> The Secy Gen informed the house about the Qualification chart Asian Games for Show Jumping and Eventing. Details are attached as <b><u>Appx 'B'</u></b>. At this juncture Mr Jitu Virwani submitted to the house that Mr Amar Sarin be allowed to go through balance two trials at any other location to which Secretary General responded that even if he is made to go through the trials and he qualifies, his horse will not be able to move out of Delhi to enter EDFZ due to glander situation. Then Mr Jitu Virwani submitted, in that case he be allowed to give trials abroad in one round competition as there are not enough two round competitions available. Then the matter was discussed in detail by all the members of EC &amp; SC.</p>	<p><b><u>Decision of EC :-</u></b> The house directed that such exception will violate the selection criteria therefore the rider must compete in two round competitions abroad like other riders are doing. <p>4.10 <b><u>REL Qualification Chart.</u></b> The Secretary General presented the REL Qualification Chart. Details of the same are attached at <b><u>Appx 'C'</u></b>. Due to only few numbers of athletes qualifying for NEC the Secy Gen wanted to know from the member whether the qualifying requirements be made more lenient by increasing the acceptable penalty from 12 to 16 to which members did not agree. <p>4.12 <b><u>Dope Testing.</u></b> The Secy Gen informed the house about the incidence of +ve result of dope testing in respect of Ris Dinesh Kumar's horse Jeet, the combination which has come in the first position of CCI1* held at Meerut wef 12-15 Oct 2017. He requested Mr Jitu Virwani of EIRS to throw more light on the proposal. Mr Jitu Virwani informed the house that by recognizing the sports Horse Stud Book India LLP EFI can be a partner of this effort and can earn some revenue for it. <p>4.14 <b><u>Selection Committee Meeting held on 06<sup>th</sup> Mar 2018.</u></b> The Secy Gen informed the house a Selection Committee meeting was held on 06<sup>th</sup> Mar 2018 at QMG's Conf Hall which was chaired by the President EFI. The details of the decision taken are as per <b><u>Appx 'E'</u></b>. The Secy Gen brought out that there has been a minor mistake while revising the Selection Criteria for Dressage on 06<sup>th</sup> Mar 2018 due to misinterpretation of the original Selection Criteria thus leading to representation from some riders. He pointed out that, although the applicability of CDNs in place of National Championship was rightly modified but the clause of 3 FEI Judge mandatory for CDN is incorrect. At this point Brig Sameer Lanba, VSM and Brig Adil Mahmood informed the house that the selection committee members had discussed this issue before coming to the EC Meeting and they have unanimously agreed to remove this clause as CDNs being national events may not have 3 FEI Judges always. Brig Deep Ahlawat, VSM member Eventing pointed out that Eventing CCI /National Championship written in Para 17 (a) of Selection Criteria must be amended as Eventing CCI* only. National Championship be deleted as the tech standard for Eventing is CCI* and National Championship do not hold CCI* as the same is termed as CCN*</p>	<p><b><u>Decision of EC:-</u></b> The house discussed the issue in detail and agreed to accept CDNs (3 FEI Judge not mandatory) as trials for selection by riders based abroad. The house also agreed to the suggestion of Brig Deep Ahlawat, VSM and directed the Secy Gen to amend the clause accordingly.</p>		
<p>4.15 <b><u>Proposal for Metro Equestrian League (MEL).</u></b> The Secy General proposed a new concept of MEL to make equestrian Sports public friendly and interesting. <p>4.16 <b><u>Glander Situation.</u></b> The Secy Gen requested Col Amit Kumar Rastogi to brief the house on Glander Situation in the country. Col Amit Kumar Rastogi said that the last glander case was culled on 23<sup>rd</sup> Mar 2018 which means the ban on horse movement will be till 23 Jun 2018 and likely to be extended if there are any new cases.</p>	<p><b><u>Decision of EC:-</u></b> House perused the report.</p>

<p>4.17 <b>3<sup>RD</sup> Show Jumping Trial at AGL Stables.</b> Before discussing the issue the President requested to all the Special Invitees except Brig TS Hassanwalia (Retd), Member DRDC to leave the house for discussion of the matter only by the EC Members. After all the special invitee left the house the President expressed his strong displeasure at the incidence that has taken place during 3<sup>rd</sup> Asian Trial Show Jumping at AGL Stables on 06<sup>th</sup> Feb 2018. He then directed the Secy Gen to narrate the complete incident to the EC without taking any names. The Secy Gen narrated the incident which is as under.</p> <p>“3<sup>rd</sup> Asian Trial (Show Jumping) was scheduled to be held at AGL Stables on 06<sup>th</sup> Feb 2018. On 05<sup>th</sup> Feb 2018 both the Course Designer and Asst Course Designer visited the AGL Stables in the afternoon and did the preliminary layout of the course. On 06<sup>th</sup> Feb 2018 at 7 ‘O’ Clock both the Course Designer reached the venue and did the final layout of the course and proceeded for breakfast. After breakfast when they returned back to the arena they found the Ground Jury in the arena and handed over the course plan. Thereafter the Ground Jury checked the course and found the anomalies which are given in <b>Appx ‘G’</b>. Thereafter the course designers and the ground jury rectified the anomalies before starting the event thus ensuring the trial on a technically correct course.”</p> <p>The President then asked the members to discuss the incident and fix responsibilities while discussing the issue Brig Gyan Puri complemented the President Ground Jury for identifying the anomalies which had occurred during their absence from the show ground when they had gone for breakfast. He further said the course was rectified before the trial. There might have been a lapse in their part for which he was apologetic but wanted to know what was the reason of PGJ complaining about these anomalies when he himself is part of the same team of officials and is equally responsible to ensure lay out of a proper course.</p>	<p><b><u>Decision of EC:-</u></b></p>

<p>At this junction Col PP Singh (Retd) said that he was asked by Lt Gen AJ Singh on 06<sup>th</sup> Feb evening about the incident at AGL Stables. At this juncture Brig Gyan Puri asked Col PP Singh whether he had written to the President to which Col PP Singh (Retd) flatly refused and at the same breath he said that on being asked he had brought the details of incident to the notice of the President. Brig TS Hassanwalia (Retd) intervened and said the whole issue is about using the cups of wrong specification. As per specification the depth of cup should be between 18 to 30mm to which Col PP Singh (Retd) said that his facts are correct and it should not be more than 18mm. Brig TS Hassanwalia (Retd) said that the cups were not produced to them to which Col PP Singh (Retd) answered that he was not asked by anyone to do so but if required he can produce the photographs of the cups. During the discussion the President stated that every official should be accountable for their deeds and there should be no dereliction of duties. He himself is ready to resign from the post of President EFI if he fails to discharge his duties correctly. Therefore, nobody should be above board and take ownership of their mistakes. He further stated that there seems to be some sort of nexus between officials and various stake holders which is detrimental to transparency in sport. While commenting on the recommendation of the DRDC the President said the committee, instead of pinpointing the responsibility has given frivolous recommendation which is not in the interest of sport. Finally he said “ I leave it at this otherwise I had the intention to impeach the erring officials in the AGM. The details of the incidence and the subsequent action are given in <b><u>Appx ‘H’</u></b>.</p>



  - ✓ All the top poles were tightly wedged in between the wings, not allowing any movement of the pole whatsoever thus preventing its fall, whereas the pole should be able to rotate freely in its cup
  - ✓ All the top cups were of wrong description and size. There were standard size cups available but they were used in other rungs rather than the topmost important rung. This was observed in 100% fences. These cups were measured in situ and the course designer agreed to them being of wrong specification. On being asked as to where such cups have been got from as they are not available in India, all feigned ignorance. In my knowledge, such cups are used abroad by some not so above board coaches for rapping the horses before a competition and these are strictly banned by the FEI under the abuse of horses and unfair practice. Even the top plank of the fence using flat cups and planks had an obstruction on the top flats to prevent the plank from falling off when struck by the horse
  - ✓ On checking, at least five fences out of the eleven of 1.40/1.60m dimensions as mentioned in the course plan were of lesser height or width by 05cms or more thus lowering the technical specifications of the entire course
