Dear General Ambre,

- 1. Thank you for granting me this meeting with you.
- 2. My main points are as under :-

### a) EFI Calendar:

The long overdue Competition Calendar for the year 2018-2019 has finally been put up on the website just 3 days ago. It is apparent that no thought has gone into its making. The National Showjumping Championship has been notified with only 1 months notice. It is ridiculous to assume that a rider can prepare his horse to the fitness level required to participate in the National Championship at such short notice and transport his horses from across the country to the show venue. To say the least, this demonstrates complete apathy towards the horses and riders who are the backbone of this Sport.

The Junior Nationals have arbitrarily been given to Calcutta after being promised to EIRS Bangalore. Calcutta does not have the facilities or arena to hold such an event. Their main arena is a lake tank currently under 15 feet of water. It dries up only around November when it is ploughed and made into an arena. Such a rough and ready arena cannot be used for such an important event. I attach a copy of a photograph taken on 16.07.2018 of the so called main arena in Tollygunge Club Calcutta which has been approved and put into the calendar by the Secretary General of the EFI. It is pertinent to mention that they do not have the requisite practice and warm up arenas as required for a National Championship. Just because rules have not been followed in the past and National Events have been conducted at this venue doesn't mean that is a license for continuing to violate rules with impunity. Riders and owners have invested crores of rupees on importing top class horse flesh and creating facilities and World Class Footing. How do you expect them to risk these horses by making them jump in a rock hard lake bed where the only preparation will be ploughing and harrowing by a tractor.

No camping is provided for Army horses, they have to camp in Fort William almost 20 kms away and move through heavy traffic every day.

The complete calendar needs to be discussed and systematically planned. I wonder what the Secretary General was doing all this time.

Please find attached mails by me and other riders on this and other subjects. I request credible answers from the Federation.

### b) Rider representative :-

It is of paramount importance for a rider rep to be incorporated into all decision making of the calendar and other policy matters. This rep should also travel to all venues at least 3 months before to check the facilities and forward his report to the Federation. We have seen as a case in point how these important aspects were

neglected in the last JNEC in Bhopal about which I had written to you. (Copy attached). It is the riders who suffer the most from these decisions and therefore have a major stake in them. The rider rep should be the senior most actively competing rider who has represented India in the Asian Games and been National Champion in Dressage and Showjumping and a medal winner in National Eventing. I think I am most suitable for this job and offer my services.

c) <u>Corruption and misuse of scarce Federation resources by the Secretary General</u>:-

This needs to be addressed on a war footing. Rs 15000 to 20000 per month are spent on CHTs used mostly by the Secy Gen. One clerk is used exclusively for his own personal work and claims. The EFI Despatch Rider 80% of the time does his personal work, shopping and conveys his sahayak up and down from his residence to the unit where he is attached for meals. The car diary is filled by the DR himself and not by the officer as is the rule. The officer is away on TD for a major part of the year and has estimated to have spent nearly 10 lacs of govt money on his own claims. He has also spent nearly 20 lacs of EFI money on his trips since he has taken over. He now plans another one to Lausanne Switzerland for a frivolous reason.

A glance through the month wise and yearly expenditure of the Federation during the last 3 years will show you that while vast sums of money have been spent on the travel, foreign exchange and accommodation of officials almost no money has been spent on sponsoring riders to compete abroad. The riders and selected National Teams have all been paid for by the Govt.

d) Shocking loss of records by the Federation :-

I enclose a mail written by the Secretary General to Mr Kapil Modi a renowned rider and former National champion. In this mail the Secretary General has reduced my long and successful career of over 38 years into just 3 lines and has completely ignored a lifetime of achievements. He has not even had the courage to admit that the records are lost. There is a huge difference between saying that "as per our records this is it" and admitting that the records are lost. When I recently spoke to the Secretary General RK Swain about this instead of being apologetic he was rude and aggressive and took the stand that he wasn't responsible as they were lost before his time. Even if that is so what may I ask has he been doing in the last 3 years since he took over? What efforts have been made to recreate the records by writing to riders, accessing sports archives, the internet and various other means of retrieving information. Is it enough to simply say they are lost and close the chapter? Would this be accepted in the Army if the records section of the Army HQ were to say that they have lost the service particulars of all officers?

3. I conclude by requesting you to kindly investigate and rectify all the issues brought out by me so that we can jointly strive to bring up the standard of the Equestrian Sport in India.

- (f) In case the OC fails to meet the technical & administrative requirement for conduct of the show, the Technical Delegate will recommend cancellation of the show. The Federation reserves the right to cancel such shows. In event of such cancellation, the organizer will forfeit his advance.
- (g) It is the responsibility of the OC to ensure that horses are entered in the correct grade only. Latest grading list will be obtained from EFI office. They will also ensure use of safety cups and electronic timers for all events.
- (h) The OC will also ensure that the EFI flag, medals and rosettes are collected from the EFI secretariat 2 weeks prior to commencement of National events. The flag and surplus medals/rosettes will be returned to Federation office on completion of the show.
- (i) The OC will organize electronic and print media coverage and issue press releases in time, in consultation with the Technical Delegate/ Secretary General Equestrian Federation of India.
- (j) The OC will appoint a person as a contact person to interact with the Federation on all issues connected with the Show. It is recommended that the contact person be also the Show Secretary and is available with the OC/ one month prior to the Show and till completion of events.
- (k) The results of various events will be e-mailed/faxed to the EFI office within 24 hours of completion of last event of the show.
- (I) Original result sheets along with other supporting documents duly signed by the jury for all events will be dispatched to the Federation office within 4 days of completion of show.
- (m) Veterinary facilities must be made available 24 hours in the camp. During the conduct of events at the show ground, Veterinary first aid must always be made available.
- (n) First Aid & Ambulance with Doctor must be available during the conduct of events.
- (o) The Ground Jury, Technical Delegate, Course Designer & Veterinary Commission for all National and International events will be detailed by the EFI.

- 2. The organizer will have to comply with the following in addition to the Corpus Money paid :-
  - (a) Airfare of Foreign Judges if required, for the show.
  - (b) Airfare, transport and local/hospitality for the Technical Delegate/FEI/EFI officials detailed for the show.
  - (c) Normal jumping events (Preliminary, Novice, Medium, Intermediate and Advance) and Dressage events in all grades will be conducted along with maximum children events. Eventing in all grades (Pre-Novice, Novice, and One Star) will be conducted where CNC / CCN events are being conducted.
  - (d) The OC will give an honorarium of Rs.1000/- to all civilian/Retd officers detailed in connection with the show along with their travel, boarding & lodging.
  - (e) The OC of Tent Pegging will conduct all Tent Pegging disciplines as per EFI rules.
- 3. The Bid Evaluation Committee will scrutinize all bids received and allot events to the organizer. The decision of the Bid Evaluation Committee will be final and the committee reserves the right to reject a bid. In such cases, the advance of the corpus money would be refunded.

## REGIONAL EQUESTRIAN LEAGUE (REL) GUIDELINES: SHOW JUMPING, TENT PEGGING AND JNEC

### Introduction

1. Unlike other sports, equestrian field does not have Distt / State level championship due to lack of infrastructure, as a result of which many a time naïve horse-rider combinations have participated in National championships thereby diluting the sanctity of the National Level competition. REL concept has been developed to offer more opportunities to riders to participate in various competition within the region and qualify themselves to compete at National level.

### **Objective**

2.

- (a) Promote Equestrian sports at Regional Level by empowering Regional Members.
- (b) Promote more civilian organizing committee & civil venues to hold equestrian events.
- (c) Popularize the sports throughout the country.
- (d) Offer more competitions to horse-rider combinations in their own region thereby reducing the burden of transportation cost.
- (e) Select horse rider combination worthy of participation at National level.

### Concept

- 3. To achieve the above objectives, holding of Equestrian competitions at regional level is proposed on the lines of World Challenge Jumping (WCJ) for which the country will be divided into following zones: -
  - (a) North Zone (J&K, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Union Territories of Chandigarh and Delhi).
  - (b) East Zone (West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and Orissa).
  - (c) West Zone (Maharashtra, Goa, Gujarat, and Rajasthan).
  - (d) South Zone (Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telengana and Puducherry).
  - (e) Central Zone (UP, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Uttrakhand).
  - (f) North East Zone (Assam, Manipur, Nagaland, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Tripura, Meghalaya and Mizoram).
- 4. Respective Zonal Members shall be responsible to organize regional championships.

- 5. One EFI Rep (CD/Jury as per the request of OC) shall be detailed for each horse show to ensure that the desired levels are not diluted.
- 6. Course plans for show jumping will be provided by EFI to be followed at all venues so as to have uniformity in level of competition for all and for Dressage and Tent Pegging uniform standards as per tech guidelines of EFI will be followed.
- 7. The MER as per appx will be followed and rider must participate at minimum of two venues and achieve 02 MERs to be eligible to participate in NEC/ JNEC.
- 8. To qualify for the Nationals, rider may participate in any number of competitions being held at various venues all over the country to achieve the desired MER.
- 9. At present REL is introduced only for the following categories:
  - (a) <u>Seniors:</u> Only in Show Jumping (Novice & Grade III) and Tent Pegging.
  - (b) Juniors: Only in Show Jumping and Dressage (Junior, Children I & Children II).
- 10. Rest of the categories except mentioned above will not be included in REL and the riders can participate directly in NEC/JNEC as applicable.
- 11. Expenditure on transportation, accommodation & hospitalities of officials shall be borne by the organizers.
- 12. Organizers to use their own infrastructure.
- 13. Course Plans and Dressage tests for these categories are attached as appx 'A' to 'F'

### Incentive

14. Incentive will be given by EFI to a club once in a calendar year. Rs 50,000/- will be given if participation of over 25 riders and Rs 25,000/- to be given for less than **25** riders.

### **Procedure**

- 15. Interested organizers may forward their bids to EFI after due consultation with Regional Member regarding the exact dates of event. The recommendation of Member Region is mandatory. On receipt of the bids the same will be evaluated by the Bid Evaluation Committee for allotment of events. On allotment of the event the same will be included in the EFI Calendar for 2018-19 which will facilitate all horse-rider combinations to plan their move to various venues and participate to achieve MER to qualify for NEC.
- 16. Organizers will have to deposit a refundable security of Rs 50,000/- alongwith bid which will be refunded with incentive mentioned in Para 15 on successful completion of event. In case of non completion of event as per EFI guidelines security deposit will not be returned.





Dear Sir

On behalf of State Associations, I am bringing following points to your attention which has been placed to EFI on many occasions by me as a West Zone Member in 2009-2010 both in meetings as well as through letter without any results so far.

- 1. Government of India Ministry of Sports rules, regulations and code EFI is a high priority game and is given lot of financial assistance, awards and benefits to the sports person. Unfortunately EFI does not follow MYAS sports code and gives direct memberships to individuals, clubs, schools etc with voting right. This is violation of sports code and will one day lead to major setback to EFI.
- 2. Due to the above States are sidelined because the clubs, schools and institutions which fall under any state are direct members of EFI and hence they do not want to pay dual fee by becoming member of their respective State.
- 3. Similarly all such members i.e clubs , institutes, individuals are allowed to take part at the Nationals without going through the procedure of State Championship and / or Selection trial at the respective State.
- 4. Doing this EFI then cants State to submit their activity report which is practically impossible because after directly participating at the nationals, why riders will take part at the State Championship as they see no benefit in this. This has resulted to non activity of State Association and when this happens EFI blames them to be a defunct State Association.

5. Sport persons also suffer due to this policy except for the defense personals, because when a domicile of any State directly participate at the National and wins medal he/ she is not given any State award, cash award or benefits because State Association is not involved and preper procedure of participation at the Nationals is not followed.

6. EFI new to think on these issues and has to work on strengthening the State Associations for long run promotion of the Equestrian Sport.

EFI also needs to think and work on giving more voice to State Associations at the Executive. Role of Defense cannot be denied to promote, popularize Equestrian Sports in India but to deny the due credit of the civilians to make such an expensive sport accessible to schools, youngsters through their personal resources is not correct.

I personally feel that time has come for EFI to consider State Associations as their counterparts and not as an outsider who is trying to sneak in unnecessarily.

We had asked for a State association meeting with the EFI to discuss these points and streamline our joint effort, but as it has not materialized till date, I take this opportunity to place before you our representation for your kind consideration.

The medals and certificates for a few years were issued under the auspicious of the EFI but later due to its growing popularity the EFI withdrew its affiliation from the championships. Since then the IHSI continues to host them on their own.

The IHSI has also hosted under the auspicious of the EFI International Tent Pegging and Endurances at Dundlod with the Rajasthan Equestrian Association and has had a record number of entries.

From the above it is evidently clear that the interest of the riders from the Indigenous sector is on the increase and as the population of the Indigenous breeds are a lot more from any other in India, due promotion and exposure be given to them by the EFI through the IHSI and affiliated State Associations.

Our suggestions in this regard are as under:--

- 1. Encourage more Indigenous participation at the Nationals
- 2. At the REL a section for Indigenous horses be promoted separately with different standards for at least 3 to 5 years to give exposure to riders and horses to come up to the National Standards.
- 3. Venues for REL and other events be selected keeping in view the accessibility of maximum indigenous horses.
- 4. Coaching camps for indigenous riders and horses be organized separately.
- 5. To induct officials from the indigenous sector after providing due training for the same.

Sir.

- 1. Endurance started in India around 30 years back but even today it is in its very primitive state, rather in last few years number of participants and also organisers has gone down drastically. On the contrary the sport is gaining popularity in rest of the world. With the aim of reviving the sport in India all Endurance Enthusiasts have joined hands and planned to develop the sport in systematic manner and to ensure representation of Indian team in Endurance world Championship in next five years. Road Map has already been planned which will be produced in front of EFI officials in the proposed meeting.
- 2. To achieve the desired goal and to follow planned Road Map support and blessings of EFI is extremely necessary. To achieve the same and to present the plan to develop the sport, it is requested that a meeting be planned between the EFI Officials (The President, Secretary General and any other EFI officials as desired by EFI) and Endurance Enthusiasts at the earliest feasible. As people need to travel from various parts of our country (Dibrugarh, Pondicherry, Bangalore, Maharashtra, Gujrat and Rajasthan) adequate notice is requested. Any date between 03 July to 20 July is ok depending on availability of President and other EFI officials however most convenient date for all Endurance Enthusiasts is 11/12 July.
- 3. In addition to above mentioned presentation the following major points are proposed to be discussed:-
  - (a) Revision of EFI Endurance Rules in line with FEI Endurance Rules. (Proposed EFI Endurance rules will be mailed to EFI before the date of meeting)
  - (b) All Endurance Events in India be graded as CEN Events and Approval of Draft endurance calendar for Equestrian Season 2018-19 (Proposed calendar will be presented during the meeting).
  - (c) Increasing number of endurance officials in India by conducting training capsule for volunteers by any EFI Endurance official. All recommended by capsule conducting official to be included in the list of EFI endurance officials, as done by FEI.
  - (d) EFI to take up case with NABL to accredit more Laboratories to conduct test of equines. Presently there are only two accredited labouratories in India. CMVL Meerut and NRCE, Hisar.
  - (e) Waver from deposit of corpus money and Entry fee to EFI to conduct an Endurance Event.
- 4. It is requested that some time out of busy schedule of President and all officials of EFI be spared and suitable date, time and place be informed for the proposed meeting. It is assured that cent percent positivity will be ensured and all communication will be with the motive to develop the sport in India. Around 10 Endurance Enthusiasts are likely to attend the subject meeting.

#### Dear EC Members.

As a member of the Efi and a parent of a child who regularly competes in Dressage and has twice represented India at the FEI world Dressage challenge ,getting the highest score for our country from the Indian team at ages 14 and 16 and at age 15 won best rider at the senior nationals in 2016 January, I personally plead to the members to look closely at the schedule taking certain factors into mind. The manner in which the schedules are handled is very discouraging and it seems that instead of promoting the fading sport of dressage the federation simply wants it to die. Sorry state of affairs.

Firstly due to glanders outbreak the NEC dressage 2018 had been postponed, with fresh dates intimidated to us recently, Bang in the middle of September! A month where most students have exams, roads are terrible for horses to travel, and most importantly the footing in most centres is wet and mushy and no advanced dressage movements can be perfected. Now there is another outbreak of glanders in delhi, for us to travel to Meerut we have the flowing difficulties

1. We have to avoid delhi completely so therefore the road in much longer and not a highway. The roads are terrible. My horse recently travelled on this road in April and it took her 2.5 days to come to Meerut.

2. There are no facilities for civilians , with regard to living , very few hotels.

3. It is a plane ride plus a long driving road. It takes a full day to reach for competitors.

4 September is a highly inconvenient month, it is humid and there are still rains in most southern states.

5. After the NEC , we do not know where the Asian trial will be. Again we have to travel , both riders, horses , coaches , this is a very expensive exercise.

6 Meerut will not allow the horse to continue staying there, horses coming from all places have to return home. Before going to the next

7. Then go wherever you decide for the junior under trial.

8. Then after that go to the FEI dressage challenge.

9. Then the NEC 2019 is scheduled in New Delhi in January. We cannot take horses back and forth from Mumbai, we will have to request 10. Most important by

10. Most important horses are not in peak condition for the most important show of the season, the nationals. For either lack of footing due to rains, or the heat and dust in some places.

We are in the midst of the monsoon, my horse has just come back from Meerut a month ago, the roads were absolutely terrible. Potholes by the interrest of the large holes have been provided in the interrest of the large holes.

In the interest of the Horse I plead to the EC, since delhi is not possible for a few months to host all events in a central location like for example Pune, NDA

Also for riders to be able to compete in more competition, make it economically feasible for riders

Since the NEC is being planned either have the judges move to 3 centres north, south and central or hold all 3 events together in October lust before the EEL world down.

Just before the FEI world dressage challenge, the trial for Asian under 21 and NEC can be held in Jaipur or Bangalore or pune. For example the NEC and Asian trial can be held @ 25 October, before that the coaching camp and then the FEI dressage challenge as scheduled all in one location. The event in Quatar is scheduled for 15-17 November which gives enough time.

This way riders, mounts, coaches will move once, book accommodations once and spend on airline tickets once. It will be like a festival of dressage. Roads are better for the horses and the most important is horses do not need to travel back and forth and the federation will have taken care of Horse welfare. Also one last request please talk to some of us riders\parents to understand our difficulties and let's work together to revive this sport. I from my end are willing to extend any help the federation needs.

Kindly consider my above plea in the interest of riders and horses
