MINUTES OF 61ST ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING 2022 OF EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA HELD ON 09TH JUL 2023 AT DEFENCE SERVICES OFFICERS' INSTITUTE, DHAULAKUAN, NEW DELHI

- 2. Dr SY Quraishi, learned Observer appointed by Hon'ble Delhi High Court chaired the meeting in terms of court order dt 07 Jul 2023 in the matter WP (C) 10342/2019 of Rajasthan Equestrian Association (REA) Vs Equestrian Federation of India.
- 3. Opening address by Dr SY Quraishi, Learned Observer appointed by Hon'ble Delhi High Court, Chair of the meeting: Dr SY Quraishi while introducting himself said that he is forced to chair the meeting as per Hon'ble Delhi High Court direction due to legal proceeding in the said court. He info the house that with respect to the last paragraph of the order which states that resolution passed by the AGM shall be subject to final outcome of the petition and thus he suggested to all members that they should remember these directions during the course of the meeting. The second suggestion he made to the house was to limit their discussion to the agendas published which is as per para 7 of the court order dt 07 Jul 2023 since the order has to be complied with.

He further stated that there are number of clubs which are not registered with EFI, however the Fed issues passports for their horses, their riders take part in EFI/FEI events and Fed get their entries done in FEI events. The FEI accepts registration of horses and rider only through NF. In some of these unregistered clubs due to infighting clubs, they have tried to involve the Fed. Also, to ensure FEI /EFI rules on Horse welfare, functioning of club etc, it is necessary that only horses and riders who are member of EFI registered clubs should take part in EFI events and their entry to be forwarded by their respective clubs alongwith entry fee to this NF other than RELs. Also, if an individual is a Life/ Individual member of EFI, they can get their horse passport from EFI but they can participate either themselves or their dependant NOK upto the age of 21 yrs only in EFI events on own horses. 

G.S.R.(E).— In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 25 of the Customs Act, 962 (52 of 1962), the Central Government, on being satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest so to do, hereby takes the following further amendments in the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance Department of Revenue), No. 146/94-Customs, dated the 13th July, 1994, published in the Gazette of India, xtraordinary, Part II, Section 3, Sub-section (i), vide number G.S.R. 575 (E), dated the 13th July, 1994, namely:-

In the said notification, -

- (i) in the TABLE, against S. No. 2, in column (2), in item XXIII. EQUESTRIAN, after sub-item (6), e following sub-item shall be inserted, namely: -
 - "(7) Warm Blood horse":
 - (ii) the Explanation, occurring after the TABLE, shall be omitted;
 - (iii) the following paragraph shall be inserted at the end, namely: -
 - "2. Nothing contained in this notification shall have effect after the 31st March, 2028.".

This notification shall come into force on the 2nd day of February, 2023.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE (SOP) FOR OBTAINING RECOMMENDATION OF EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI) FOR IMPORT OF HORSES

INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Equestrian sports in India have not reached the desired level of excellence. The main reasons of this state has been non-availability of quality horses to the Indian riders. The indigenous breeds are not capable of winning medals for India in the EFI listed disciplines of the Sport at the International levels.
- 2. Hence, there is a requirement for importing of horses by individuals/Clubs to facilitate growth of sport and win laurels at the Olympics/Asian Games and related international events. The import of live stock is regulated by Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), Government of India.
- 3. Government of India, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Department of Commerce, Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) vide their letter No01/53/8/AM19/O-5/IC (Trade Notice No 49/2015-2020) dated 15 March 2019 have directed that Equestrian Federation will issue recommendation for import of horses for sportsmen. As the onus for recommendation for import of Sporting Horses have been assigned by DGFT, it is incumbent on the part of EFI to lay down necessary protocols/procedures to be adopted before according recommendation for the intended import by concerned individual/club who are members of EFI.

PROPOSAL

4. To formulate a policy defining the formalities and procedures for issue of 'Recommendation' of EFI for import of horses as stipulated in Govt of India, Directorate of Foreign Trade (DGFT) Para 5 of letter No 01/53/8/AM19/O-5/IC (Trade Notice No 49/2015-2020) dated 15 March 2019.

DETAILED JUSTIFICATION

- 5. Good quality horses are the lifeline for any equestrian sport. To ensure that the sport grows it is important that provision exist for import of horses for sporting purposes to facilitate growth of the sports in the country to enable the Indian team/athletes to win laurels at the International level. Government of India, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Department of Commerce, Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) have issued explicit guidelines (Schedule 1 Import Policy of ITC (HS), 2017 refers) wherein a 'Recommendation' of Govt of India Ministry of Agriculture, Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries is required for import of Horses under live stock which is similar to their requirement for import of Horses for sportsmen.
- 6. <u>Criteria of Individual/Clubs for Import</u>. A member of EFI for three years prior to import and also should have participated in EFI events for the same duration. However, a waiver may be considered on case to case basis depending upon the performance of individual/club in equestrian competitions.



- 7. <u>Acquiring Horses Passport from EFI</u>. An EFI passport will be obtained within three month of import of Horse/Horses by the individual/Club.
- 8. <u>Maximum Limit per Individual/Club for Import of Horses</u>. As the onus for giving recommendation for import of sporting horses has been left to EFI by DGFT, it is incumbent for EFI to regulate the quantities of horses which can be imported by the individual/club. A maximum of 9 horses by an individual and 12 horses by a Club may be permitted in a cycle of 18 months.
- 9. The individual/club importing horse/horses have to adhere the following aspects to ensure that import of horses is only for Equestrian sports and not for any Business/commercial activity: -
 - (a) Strict Vet Protocols as per GOI guidelines for import of Horses.
 - (b) Specific documentation in r/o the Horses being imported with details like complete history sheet, etc.
 - (c) Defining cities for quarantine area for horse imported on arrival in India.
 - (d) Diagnostic/Vet tests of the horse/horses on arrival in India.
 - (e) Management and up keep of data of all imported horses incl sale/purchase of the horses imported for the complete life span of horses.
 - (f) Promoters to ensure no malpractices/business model runs though the practice of Import and it is strictly for development of the sport.
 - (g) In case of any imported horses being found unfit for sporting purposes and the owner intends to utilize same for other purposes, the EFI should be informed within three months. Also, if the importer/horse owner decides to use such horse(s) for breeding, the same will be communicated to EFI and necessary approval as per policy existing, from Govt of India, Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries should be obtained. Necessary approval for breeding in case of such horses if not obtained from Govt of India, Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries within three months, the off springs of such horses which has been diverted for breeding purposes, will not be registered with EFI if not intimated to EFI in time stipulated.

PROCEDURE: RECOMMENDATION OF EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI) FOR IMPORT OF HORSES

Pre - Import

10. All individuals/Clubs desirous to import horses for sporting purpose for disciplines as stipulated by EFI will forward an affidavit on non judicial stamp paper of Rs 100/- to EFI mentioning intended disciplines for which they wish to import horse/horses.



- 11. The affidavit should cover data as given in Appendix 'A' as applicable (Individual/Club). The individuals/clubs should be a member of EFI and should be participating in any of the EFI approved events since last three years in both cases. They (Individual /club) will pay import duty, transportation charges, etc as applicable under extant law, rules and/or policies of the concerned Statutory Agencies.
- 12. Exemption of Custom duty on the import of Warm Blood Horses will be accorded by EFI to Sportsman of outstanding eminence as per MYAS, Govt of India letter No 1-9/92-SP.IV dated 13th July 1993, Annexure XXX of NSDCI-2011 (copy attached as appendix 'B'). Such Individuals should apply with EFI for Custom Duty Exemption Certificate (CDEC) at least three weeks prior to the horse/horses arrival in India. The documents mandated are stated below:-
 - (a) Request letter from individual to the Federation Specimen attached as Annexure A
 - (b) Confirmation of flight schedule /Air Way Bill A self attested copy to be provided by the Importer
 - (c) Rs 100/- Affidavit.
 - (d) Invoice.
 - (e) Proforma for CDEC.

- Specimen attached as Annexure B
- A self attested copy to be provided by the Importer
- Specimen attached as Annexure C
- 13. An individual/club can import only Sport Horses as permitted in law by Government of India regulations revised from time to time and based on specification and details provided in the application, once, in a cycle of 18 months. If the individual/club seeks to apply for a fresh license and needs EFI's recommendations within the 18 months period of the earlier license, a further application setting out the justification for the same will be mandated.
- 14. Recommendation for import of horse/horses as per format attached as **Appendix 'C'** will be issued by EFI on receipt of affidavit and due deliberation.

Post-Import

- 15. An EFI passport will be obtained within three month of import of Horse/Horses by the individual/Club. The owner will provide the following information: -
 - (a) No of Horses imported vis-à-vis Recommendation of EFI obtained of number of Horses.
 - (b) Supporting documents of Horses imported: -
 - (i) Copy of Import Licence
 - (ii) Original Passport
 - (iii) Microchip Number
 - (iv) Quarantine Certificate at Export & Import locations

Responsibility of EFI

16. This National Federation will maintain a data bank which will be regularly updated of all imported Horses through EFI, their profile and sporting performance. In case of death/medical permanent unfitness of imported Horse for sporting purposes, the same will also be communicated to EFI by the Owner.



Change of Ownership

17. Change of ownership of such imported horse will be done by EFI on obtaining a written application for same by the registered owner. The owner (Individual/Clubs) cannot sell the horse/horses for a period of 24 months from the date of Horse/Horses arrival in India as per extant statuary guidelines since such horses category fall within the list of prohibited items of import. In case they do so, prior permission of EFI will be obtained with detailed reasoning. In case agreed by EFI, suitable amendments to new ownership will be endorsed by the EFI in the passport.

CONCLUSION

- 18. Every applicant will abide by the extant law applicable for import of horses in India and will ensure a vet check is carried out on arrival in India as per government orders on the subject.
- 19. These imported horses will not be used for commercial purposes but only for equestrian sports conducted under the aegis of EFI.
- 20. This policy may undergo revision/amendments subject to change/amendments in underlines of statuary polices.
- 21. Intent of this SOP is not restrictive but to ensure a sound methodology, upkeep of information and data base for the EFI.
- 22. This SOP supersedes the previous SOP on the subject matter promulgated on 27 Jun 2020.

ELECTION OF ATHLETES COMMISSION

- 1. Election for 03 x Members (out of 05 Members) of Athletes Commission of Equestrian Federation of India was held on 28 Apr 2023 at ASC Riding and Polo Academy (ARPA) Bangalore during NEC Eventing.
- 2. The following preference of Indian Olympic Association (IOA) guidelines for forming Athletes Commission were followed, which are stated as under:-
 - (a) First preference for Olympians Sports in both summer and winter NSFs (Since India had small contingents in the past. Many NSF not have many Olympians and hence Olympians from last 6 Olympiads each for summer 1996 onwards and Winter 1998 onwards can be incorporated).
 - (b) Second preference to all medallist in Asian Games and Commonwealth games (maximum for last 3 times).
 - (c) Third preference will be to International Players not having above following preference:-
 - (i) Official World Championship.
 - (ii) Official World Cup.
 - (d) Fourth preference is all Asian and Commonwealth participants (from last3 Asian and Commonwealth games as the contingents were large).
 - (e) If an NSF does not have sufficient athletes from the above, NSF can have athletes from National Championship.

4. EFI statutes mandates election of only three members and since all three members fall under the IOA criteria of preference-II, Mr Balaji Vijay Shankar Rider ID-P100001 is low in preference criteria as per IOA guidelines for National Sports Federation forming Athlete Commission. Thus, the NSF has the requisite three nominees according to the preference as stipulated in IOA guidelines.
